Ms. Luo Yuyan was born in March 1966 in Yangzhou, Jiangsu Province. She is a senior engineer and a provincial-level representative inheritor of Yang-style bonsai techniques. Ms. Luo is also a member of the CPC. Currently, she serves as a Level IV Division Rank Official at the Housing and Urban-Rural Development Bureau of Taizhou Municipality, in charge of the work of the bonsai exhibition hall. She is the president of the Flower, Penjing & Stone Branch of the Chinese Society of Landscape Architecture, a member and vice president of the Women's Committee of the Chinese Society of Landscape Architecture, an executive director of the Rhododendron Branch of China Flower Association, and the director of the Yangtze River Delta Urban Landscaping and Greening Cooperation Network. Additionally, she is an executive director of the Jiangsu Association of Landscape Architecture.

Ms. Yuyan Luo has been recognized as an advanced individual by the Ministry of Housing and Urban-Rural Development, awarded the "Outstanding Woman" title by the Provincial Housing and Urban-Rural Development Department, and has received multiple honors as an advanced individual in Taizhou's greening efforts, including third-class merit awards. She was also recognized as a "New Taizhou Construction Contributor" and has twice won the "Taizhou Jumper Award". She is a member of the expert database of the Ministry of Housing and Urban-Rural Development and the Jiangsu Provincial Department of Housing and Urban-Rural Development.

Ms. Yuyan Luo has been engaged in the flower and bonsai industry for 40 years. In 1986, she became an apprentice of the Chinese bonsai master Wan Ruiming and is the seventh-generation inheritor of the "Wan Shi" Yangzhou School bonsai techniques. She was awarded the title of "National Young and Middle-aged Bonsai Star" in the first national bonsai competition. Her works have won numerous national and provincial awards, and her papers and bonsai works have been included in the "Chinese Bonsai Schools Series".

Ms. Luo She has organized the 11th National Penjing Exhibition and the 9th Jiangsu Horticultural Exposition, as well as a series of events of the Yang School Bonsai Art Seminar and the 50th Anniversary Achievement Exhibition of Qingquan Zhao's Bonsai Art. She has organized or co-organized multiple flower and garden-related activities at the Jiangsu Province Garden Expo, as well as provincial and city-level bonsai professional skills competitions, and has served as a judge (evaluator) for many provincial and city bonsai exhibitions and skill competitions.

In 2008, she successfully applied for the inclusion of Yang School (Taizhou) Bonsai Techniques as a national intangible cultural heritage item in the second batch. Her works were showcased on CCTV in 2023 and 2024, and she released first-day covers, electronic postal signs, and the "Bonsai Elegance" postal albums. Ms. Yuyan Luo has promoted research on the industrialization of bonsai and created cultural and creative bonsai gifts. She implemented the "Bonsai Craftsmanship Digital Project" to create comprehensive, authoritative, and long-lasting digital records for the preservation and inheritance of Yang School bonsai techniques.

Furthermore, Ms. Luo has continuously held the "Bonsai Lectures" to promote bonsai techniques in schools, communities, and senior universities. she has launched "Cloud Classes" and "Micro Classes" to promote and popularize bonsai techniques from multiple perspectives, laying a solid foundation for the application of Chinese bonsai techniques as a UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage.
